

Proposed Budget Cuts - Impacts to Health Services

Legislative District Analysis - SD 25

The governor's proposed cuts will have devastating consequences in communities across Los Angeles County. This factsheet looks at the impact of the cuts to families in the 25th District.¹

The governor has proposed increasing reporting requirements for children and adults enrolled in Medi-Cal to four times per year. Not only will thousands lose health coverage, but the move would also create future costs to reenroll children that will outweigh any short-term savings.²

- **In the 25th District, over 7,800 children will lose Medi-Cal coverage next year if these reporting requirements are enacted.**

The governor has proposed rolling back eligibility for low-income parents applying for Medi-Cal coverage. Under the proposal, a family of three earning above \$10,736 a year would now be ineligible for Medi-Cal coverage.

- **In the 25th District over 21,200 parents would be denied coverage when the proposal is fully implemented.**

The proposed cuts to these programs would deal a huge blow to local communities already in the midst of a severe economic downturn:

- **In the 25th District, the local economy will lose over \$60 million in revenue from the Medi-Cal and Healthy Families programs - funding that supports vital patient services and quality jobs through hospitals, community clinics and other health care providers.**

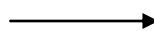
NEGATIVE IMPACTS TO LOCAL HEALTH PROVIDERS

Several local hospitals, health centers, and community clinics in the 25th District will be heavily impacted by the proposed budget cuts including:

- Centinela Freeman Regional Medical Center, Centinela Campus
- Dollarhide Health Center
- Memorial Hospital of Gardena
- MLK- MACC
- Planned Parenthood L.A.
- South Bay Family Healthcare Center
- St. John's Well Child & Family Center
- Watts Healthcare Corporation
- Westside Neighborhood Clinic

ADOPTED & PROPOSED CUTS FOR PROVIDERS:

- 10% Medi-Cal provider and managed care rate cuts
- 10% cut to Safety Net Care Pool Payments



NET IMPACT:

- Less access to care for local families
- More strain on the ER system
- Possible staff layoffs
